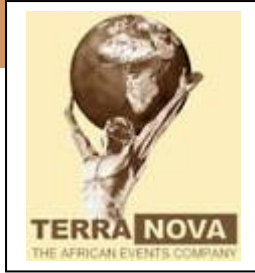

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Day 1: Arrival in Namibia

Welcome to Namibia

Arrival at Windhoek International Airport in the morning. After clearing customs, Guests are welcomed by their English Speaking Tour-Guide and the Terra Nova Project-Manager. They will lead you to smaller charter aircrafts, which have been chartered exclusively for your flight to Sossusvlei.

- 10h15 Once everyone is on board, we take off on our private charter the Sossusvlei Lodge. (Flight time: approx. 01h00m - Please note: 20 kgs of luggage in soft bags permitted). Guests will receive a snack pack on board, beautifully packaged with Fresh Fruit, Nuts, Muffin, and dried fruits to relieve any hunger pains. Bottled water and softdrinks are available on board.
- 11h30 Arrival at Sossusvlei Lodge. On arrival, welcome drinks are served and guests enjoy a buffet on the terrace with spectacular views.

Sossusvlei Lodge

Situated amidst the Namib desert at the entrance to the famous Sossusvlei, guests enter a classic lifestyle of comfort, filled with the thoughtful touch of attentive staff. The decor speaks of the art, culture and traditions of african furnishings with soft finishes of inviting comfort.

- 14h00 Check-In and time at leisure
- 18h30 Transfer from the lodge in open 4 x 4 vehicles through unspoiled desert landscape. The occasional Springbok and Pale Chanting Goshawk might just surprise you as we drive closer to the two elevated Granite outcrops. At the foot of these, find a stunning table set up. Indulge in some snacks and a glass of wine or beer. Enjoy as you see the colours changing over vast desert planes and sand dunes.

Dinner is served open air - Guests enjoy a feast of barbecued game meat like Ostrich, Zebra, Ostrich, Eland and Hartebeest served with Fresh breads and a selection of salads. Desserts and coffee complete the meal. A String Trio will entertain with local, modern and jazz music while guests have dinner

Day 02 – Sossusvlei Dune Excursion

05h30 Early Morning Wake Up Call. Coffee and rusks are served in the Lobby.

06h15 **Sossusvlei Dune Excursion**

An early start from the Lodge in your 4 x 4 vehicles to enter the Namib-Naukluft Park at sunrise, while the temperature is still mild and when the dune contrasts are at their best. After passing the 2x4 parking area, the real 4x4 driving begins, through the thick dune sand. After visiting Sossusvlei, you will walk over to Dead Vlei. The more energetic have the opportunity to climb to the upper ridge of one of the scenic dunes in the area. Enjoy a Continental Buffet Breakfast in the Vlei.

12h30 Return to the Lodge for lunch and check out (if day use rooms are booked)

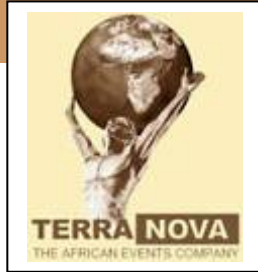
13h30 Transfer to the Gelluk Airstrip. After boarding our private aircraft we take off for our flight onto your next destination – Swakopmund.

On arrival in Swakopmund, we transfer to the Adventure Centre. Our luggage will be transferred to our tented camp.

Fun in the dunes

Transfer to the Adventure Centre for some fun in the dunes - experience the sheer thrill of riding a four-wheeled motorbike through Namibia's Sand dunes. Each guest will receive a helmet and a safety briefing from qualified and very experienced guides. After assessing each guests ability on the quadbike after a 10 minute drive through the dunes, the group will be split into "brave and a bit faster" and "not so brave and a bit slower" in order to accommodate everyone.





Tented Camp and Desert Dinner

17h00 After refreshments we will receive transfer in 4 x 4 vehicles to our tented camp, which has been exclusively erected in the Moon Landscape.

Desert Camp and Dinner

Arrive at dusk at the Tented Camp which has been especially set up for the group in the dry Riverbed. Each Tent is equipped with beds, linen, duvets, towels, soap, light and an en-suite shower. The shower will be filled up with hot water upon arrival and with the wake up call the following morning.

Subtle lighting, a myriad of candles reflecting in and off the canyon walls; tables draped in white linen and African flower decoration will provide a stylish colonial atmosphere with Namibian touch. After the traditional hand wash, guests can enjoy a buffet dinner with a variety of interesting and wholesome African dishes, followed by local and imported liqueurs which can be served and the relaxed atmosphere will be further enhanced by small talk around a crackling fire.

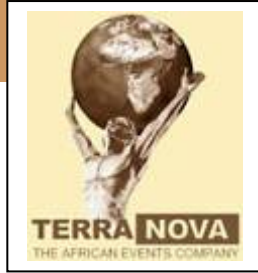
During dinner a local school Marimba band plays beautiful African music.

09h00 Departure to the Swakopmund Township, the “DRC”.

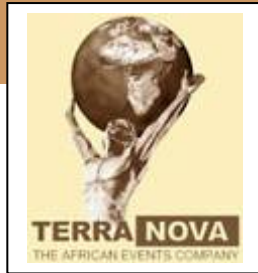
THE DRC: This is fondly named the ‘reception area’ (people waiting for houses to be built) and in the past was supposed to be temporary but has now become a permanent area for people who cannot afford to buy a house. At the moment, there is no proper sewage, water and electricity to every “home”.

The DRC School Project and Community Centre is an effort to assist the needs of a growing community in the Swakopmund Municipal District. The DRC School Project & Community Centre has created a centre for the community in order to provide services such as; basic education, health information and a cultural forum. The centre serves the community as a whole while focusing mainly on issues facing mothers and children.

After an orientational tour, guests will be split in three groups. While some start to repair the children’s playground, the second group starts painting some of the classrooms. The third group will then depart on a Township Tour in order to get an insight into the everyday life of the various communities living in the Township. The groups will rotate every 90 minutes.

14h00 It is now time for some fun on the beach. The children along with the guests are being transferred to the beach, where everyone now can take part in a volleyball or soccer match. „Boerewors Rolls“, game steaks and a variety of salads are available to fill hungry stomachs – big or small.

17h00 We transfer to the Swakopmund Hotel in the late afternoon.

Swakopmund Hotel

20h00 Departure from the hotel lobby for a short walk to the beach front.

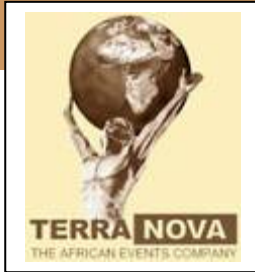

Day 04 – Etosha National Park

08h00 Breakfast at the Swakopmund Hotel and some leisure time

10h00 Guests meet in the Hotel Lobby and are being transferred to the Swakopmund Airfield. We will fly in our private charter aircrafts to the Epacha Game Lodge – flying time approx. 1 hour

12h15 On landing our private vehicles will be waiting to transfer us to the Lodge. Bottled water will be available on board. After a 10 minute transfer we arrive at Epacha.

Epacha Game Lodge

Epacha Game Lodge and Spa is situated on the 21 000 ha Epacha Game Reserve. Each of the individually decorated en-suite chalets has its own private balcony, complete with a breathtaking view across the bush. All chalets are equipped with air-conditioning, mini bar, safe, ceiling fan and coffee and tea facilities. In keeping with the Victorian era in Africa, all chalets are furnished with antiques & decorated in subtle, relaxing colors. Guests can spend time relaxing in their lounge overlooking a waterhole or in the library, smoking room, billiard room or at the pool bar. Be rejuvenated by stress relieving therapies in the Spa.

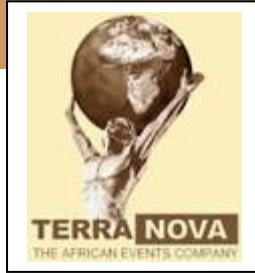

Breakfast is served in the restaurant.

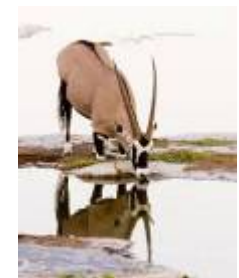
07h00 Departure for our Safari Drive in the Etosha National Park. Guests will travel through Epacha Private Game Reserve to reach the entrance to Etosha National Park.

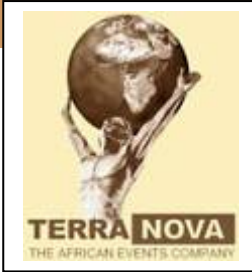
On arrival at the gate, we will enter the park.

Etosha National Park

Etosha's definitive feature is the Etosha Pan, a vast shallow depression, about 5000 sq km in size. Classified as a saline desert, the expansive white place of dry water is an unusual setting for game and the factor, which sets Etosha apart from other reserves in Africa. On some days the pan is a shimmering sheet of mirages on which the animals appear to be floating on air. A total of 114 animals are represented in the park, including several rare and endangered species such as black rhino and black-faced impala.

12h00 Return to the Lodge for a light lunch and some leisure time.





Day 05 – Out of Africa Experience

“Potjie Cook Off”

Cast iron Potjie Pots or Cauldrons are ideal for slow cooking over open fires and have been used for centuries to cook tough meat and in mystic rituals. A modern “Potjie kos (Potjie meal)” - enjoyed with abundant beer and wine - is now the outdoor social gathering of choice in Africa.

The Tourleader will take a “potjie pot” to each group member whilst they are seated and ask them to take a card from the pot. The card will identify the team that they will be allocated to.

Fireplaces will be set up, one for each team. Each team will be introduced to their “potjie chef”. Teams will be given a potjie pack, which will include various items needed to prepare the meal. Spoons, apron, recipe sheet etc. Each team will need to give their team a name and record their recipe, which will be typed up and presented to each couple the next day as a memento of the evening.

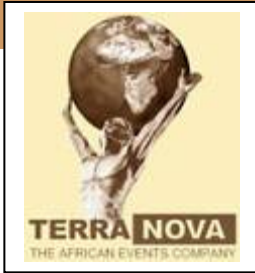
The Head Chef will do a short explanation of traditional “potjie kos” to the group before they start the preparation. Then with their chefs, each group will prepare their potjie pot. All the ingredients will be pre-prepared before hand and it will be up to the teams to decide how much and which ingredients they will add to their pots.

The preparation should take about one and a half hours. As a potjie takes approx 3 – 4 hours to cook, teams will leave the simmering in the capable hands of their chef and return to freshen up at the lodge. Just before sunset the group will return to the bush Venue where everyone will receive a traditional drum. A local artist will explain how to use a djembe drum.

18h00 During pre dinner drinks, it is time to reveal the winners of the Potjie Cook off. The Camp Manager and Tourleader will taste all Potjies before reaching a decision. The winners will be awarded prizes. Dinner is then served under the African Skye. The Potjies will be served along with the dishes the Chef has prepared. While seated around a log fire under the starry African sky, enjoy the superb food & excellent wines. The drummers will entertain with African beats while guest are enjoying their dinner.
